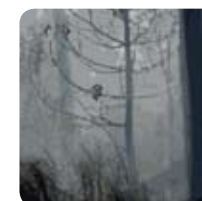
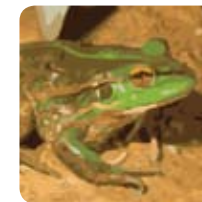

ATTRACTIVE GARDEN FLOWERS SCREENS & WINDBREAKS



This selection of indigenous native plants will provide seed, nectar, protection and nesting sites for indigenous native birds. Many have showy flowers which will create an attractive garden bursting with butterflies and birds.

Non-native (exotic) plants encourage introduced birds like Blackbirds, Sparrows, Myna's and Starlings.

Environmental weeds such as Agapanthus, Hawthorn, Montbretia, Cotoneaster, Pampas Grass and Sweet Pittosporum have become garden escapees and bush invaders.

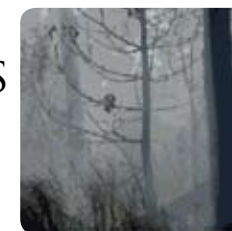
GRASSES

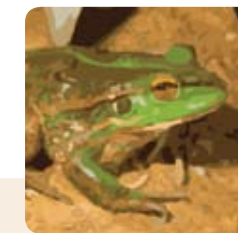

FROGS, CREATING WETLANDS



These plants can be planted around ponds/dams and in wetlands to create habitat for frogs to allow sites for breeding and protection from predators. Place rocks and logs both in and out of the water line.

- Tassel Cord-rush (*Restio tetraphyllus*)
- Tassel Sedge (*Carex fascicularis*)
- Tussock Grass (*Poa sp.*)
- Red-fruit Saw-sedge* (*Gahnia sieberiana*)
- Tall Sedge* (*Carex appressa*)
- Rush (*Juncus flavidus*)

PLANT BEYOND THE WATER LINE

- Hop Goodenia (*Goodenia ovata*)
- Golden Spray (*Viminaria juncea*)
- Spiny-headed Mat-rush (*Lomandra longifolia*)
- Scented Paperbark (*Melaleuca squarrosa*)
- Woolly Tea Tree (*Leptospermum lanigerum*)
